Instead – Do something to invite them in

Do Not Say:

All about me

And some more about the company

And some more about me

..... you have lost them







And what would happen today




Ways to Open

Here are a few ideas:

With a question

With a (shocking) fact

With a story





Core Message?

What do you want them to remember?

The main point

If they would only take away one point – what would it be?

A relevant personal story will stay in the memory

What's in it for them?

Repetition of a powerful statement










Strong Visuals





Strong Closing

What to include:

Sumarise briefly what has been presented

State the objective and be positive

Call to action – Next Steps



Q & A

How to handle questions:

Always have a few ready in case of silence

Listen and ensure you understand

Answer **that** question

Perhaps involve the audience

Don't bluff and offer email follow up if necessary

Assess your performance







Myths of Presenting

Not true at all:

Stand in one place

Don't use your hands

The audience will see your nerves

Imagine the audience naked?!



Thinking on your feet

Sometimes you must think fast:

Relax your mind

Listen carefully

Look out for visual clues

Ask them to repeat the question

Don't multi-task

Concentrate

Props and visual aids


Design of slides
